University Courses

Students in final level of Pre-Undergraduate/Non-Degree programs will take a university course. Tuition for this course is an additional \$1074 plus applicable course fees.

Students in Pre-Graduate programs taking prerequisite or upgrade courses will be charged an additional \$1074 per course.

Fees for university courses are due upon arrival at TWU

Trinity Western University Refund Policy

Refunds are payable to the student only and the student must provide a current mailing address when requesting a refund.

Students who:

- a) withdraw before their intended date of arrival (as listed in acceptance letter) will receive a 50% refund of tuition and fees paid
- b) withdraw during the first or second week of school (2 weeks following intended arrival date, as listed in acceptance letter) will receive a 25% refund of tuition and fees paid.
- c) withdraw after the second week of school (calculated as 2 weeks following the intended arrival date, as listed in acceptance letter) will receive no refund.
- d) withdraw due to failure to obtain a student visa and/or study permit will receive a full refund of tuition and fees paid. Official notice of rejection required from Canadian Embassy or Consulate.
- e) defer their start date to the following semester must do so prior to the official start date of the semester for which admission was granted and will have their tuition and fee payment forwarded to a subsequent semester to a maximum of 1 year.
